Guidelines for submission of proposal for Satellite Symposium.

For satellite symposia to be announced in the official program you should adhere to the following rules:

- 1) The symposium should be held no earlier or later than 5 days before or after IUPS Congress-2021.
- 2) It should be co-organized with local colleagues either in China (easy fast train connections with Beijing) or a place in a neighbouring country with direct flight connection to Beijing.
- 3) The speakers of the symposia should be registered for the main Congress.
- 4) The symposium should not serve commercial interests.
- 5) Title, Date, Venue, Name/email/affiliation of proposer, Speakers and the Program of the symposia should be sent to the ISPC **before February 20, 2021**, i.e. six months before the opening of the main Congress.
